Dementia Care

Transforming Lives in Dementia Care Through Innovation, Education & Support

St. Michael's dedication to dementia care is a shining example of how compassion, innovation, and education can transform the lives of residents living with dementia, their families, and caregivers.

With a focus of enhancing the lives of our residents living with dementia, St. Michael's has taken creative steps to ensure they are able to lead fulfilling lives.

One of these initiatives is our Connecting By Creating program, an inter-generational volunteer program featuring arts-based programming. Emily, the Project Coordinator, says, "Our aim is to improve the well-being of residents living with dementia through autonomy and creative self-expression while encouraging intergenerational bonds with volunteers, and increasing community understanding about dementia." The program began in December 2021 and because of its' success was recently extended. Emily adds, "Residents love working with the children plus the students gain an appreciation for seniors in the community."

With the art created from the program, an art display has been set up in the LTC front lobby, showcasing the residents' work. They have also taken these art pieces and transformed them into greeting cards which can be purchased through St. Michael's tuck cart.

St. Michael's recently introduced new technology, the PainChek ® Assessment App, and the Rejoyce workstation, tools which have proven effective in improving the well-being of residents with dementia. We continue to collaborate with organizations like Translating Research in Elder Care, (TREC) on researching measuring, and enhancing the quality of life for those living with dementia.

"Dementia programs are tailored to individual needs, enhancing engagement, motivation, and excitement among residents," says Rhianna, our Occupational Therapist. "By incorporating games and exercises, the programs help residents improve their range of motion, all while being easily adaptable to meet individual needs."

Alice is one of St. Michael's residents living with dementia who is part of the Rejoyce program. "When she was first introduced to the program there was some hesitation but now she enjoys it immensely and never misses a day," notes Rihanna.







St. Michael's cognitive group therapy sessions provide residents with an opportunity to reminisce about their childhood and engage in stimulating conversations. Rihanna adds, "Music plays a vital role in these sessions, fostering a sense of nostalgia and comfort among the residents. **Our approach to dementia care is not only about managing the condition but also about enriching the lives of those affected.**"

St. Michael's remains committed to extending dementia care beyond the residents themselves. Rosaly, our Social Worker, supports families and caregivers providing workshops and education, including online courses. "We want families and caregivers to know they are not alone on this journey. We empower families with the knowledge and tools to navigate the challenges of caring for someone living with dementia. We want families to know their loved ones can have a good quality of life with the resources we have to offer."

These initiatives are a testament to St. Michael's dedication of continually striving to enhance those living with dementia and that even in the face of this invisible disease, they can find joy and fulfillment through support, understanding, and innovative programs.
