
I am grateful for the trust and confidence families have placed in St. Michael's. Together, we will continue to build a community where seniors can thrive, celebrating their lives and contributions.

Ensuring Safety and Comfort, One Corner at a Time

In the quiet corridors and welcoming spaces of St. Michael's, there is a dedicated team working diligently behind the scenes. The unsung heroes who go beyond fixing leaky faucets and changing light bulbs - they contribute to the overall atmosphere that makes St. Michael's feel like home.

The Maintenance Department performs essential services within St. Michael's, they ensure building systems operate efficiently, machines run smoothly, and the physical condition of the buildings and grounds are well kept and maintained. It's a huge role and one the team takes quite seriously.

"Our priority is to provide the utmost in safety and comfort to our residents," says Jack, Maintenance Manager.

With over 100 years of combined experience this small but mighty team of 13 members, and growing, plays a pivotal role in ensuring a tranquil and welcoming environment.

"We begin every day with a morning meeting and go over the requirements for the day," Jack notes. "I go through the fix-it requests and prioritize what requires immediate attention." Fix-its are requests submitted by staff and family members on concerns that require repair or adjustment.

"We receive over 100 fix-its per week," Jack adds. Besides completing as many fix-its that can be completed in a day maintenance checks are conducted on all of the buildings. "We thoroughly inspect the buildings and look for any issues. We repair what we can immediately. Everything is tracked and monitored," Jack comments. Their proactive approach to preventive maintenance ensures that every corner of St. Michael's remains a safe and comfortable environment.

"Our number one priority is ensuring we are working safely," Jack states. "We are proud to say we have had only one near miss in the past five years."

He adds, "We work as a team and learn from each other. There's nothing we can't handle."

Every day is a different day for the maintenance team with a variety of challenges.

"Our equipment has served us well and we proactively plan for upgrades, but parts and supplies can present a challenge to get," Jack adds. "We have had to come up with some creative solutions when it comes to repairs but we make it happen." The new Fenwyck Heights property has proven to be a bit of a learning curve as well with the new technology used to operate the building. Jack comments, "We welcome the challenge and appreciate the opportunity to learn new things."





"We have a great team with a broad depth of knowledge," adds Mark, St. Michael's bus and delivery driver and part of the maintenance team. "We all have the utmost respect for one another. While we take our jobs seriously we tease each other and have fun too. We are a proud and humble group who believe in doing the best job we can."

"We get satisfaction from fixing something that is broken," adds Jack. "We treat staff and residents like family. We recognize each individual as unique and special, and strive to accommodate their needs and improve the quality of care."
