

President & CEO Message



As President & CEO of St. Michael's Health Group, I look forward to opportunities to meet and connect with family members of our residents. One of the topics that is often addressed is about aspects of our operations such as equipment for therapy or even our staffing levels. What I've come to realize is that we need to communicate better that

St. Michael's is a charity. Secondly, that we - like many other senior care charities - operate with a significant financial gap between government funding, resident accommodation fees and what the costs are of providing quality care supported by specialized equipment, staffing levels and programming. We've intentionally themed this edition of Caring & Sharing to showcase the overall importance of Philanthropy, and what it means to St. Michael's.

There are an estimated 86,000 registered charities in Canada which touch almost every aspect of Canadian life. We generate more than 8.1% of Canada's GDP and employ more than 2 million people. Charities, including St. Michael's, operate under tight financial constraints. Several regulatory and employment standards changes coupled with the effects of an economic downturn have contributed to increased and significant financial pressures. Higher operating costs and clear trends of diminishing financial support from funders and donors compound an already challenging budget.

With many charities receiving funding from government, it would be easy to assume that we are just fine without donations. Not so. In our case for example, the funding received from government does not cover specialized equipment and items like lifts, slings or special therapeutic supplies. In addition, the vast majority of government funding is directed at a tiny subset of large charities with 85% of all government funding going to 1% of charities. And the same holds true for donations where 5% of charities receive 75% of fundraising revenue.

Needless to say, raising funds is a continual effort for us. We work hard at self-sustainability, to generate revenue from a variety of sources in order to bridge the financial gap. Fundraising events, donation requests, grant applications, and community ventures all contribute to our operating budget. Staff members also donate regularly through payroll deductions. It's this kind of commitment from our donors that allows us to provide the highest level of care.

This is a challenge we will continue to face for the foreseeable future but with your help, our commitment is that we live our mission of providing Care with Love and Dignity, ensuring that those who call St. Michael's home receive the quality of life they so richly deserve.

average of 6-8 bingo events per month. For these events, 16 to St. Michael's is truly blessed to have an amazing volunteer and 18 volunteers are required for each bingo, which equates to over support group in FOSMSOE, the Friends of St. Michael's Society 140 volunteers contributingmore than 750 hours monthly, a total of Edmonton. This group of very active and dedicated volunteers in excess of 9,000 hours each year. Or to look at it another way, raise funds to assist with purchases of much needed equipment

and materials for the care facilities of St. Michael's Health Group. They help fill the everwidening gap between funding and actual operating need.

With 85 members currently, almost all Friends members are themselves senior citizens, and most are retired. They give of their time and energy to help benefit seniors in care and those who require support.

Special Events for Special Needs

For many years St. Michael's has been presenting a signature fundraising event in support of a specific goal. Over the last 10 years, over \$1 million has been raised to support several important initiatives within St. Michael's. The Blue Angel Dinner, This Is Home Breakfast, Because We Care Brunch and the recently launched When They Were Young fundraising evening have raised funds for a kitchen and cafeteria expansion, accessibility improvements, new beds, an outdoor patio and much more.

Currently, our focus is on a campaign to provide specialized equipment and environmental changes to our long term care centre to support residents living with dementia. More and more we are providing care for those who may not be able to speak for themselves or identify their own needs. Almost 80% of our long term care residents are living with a cognitive disability. We are still

learning about the various forms of this disease and while we cannot yet fix this condition, we can change how we care for people living with dementia. This campaign will allow us to provide technology and activities mounted on the walls for residents to access and interact with; new lighting that is

proven to work.

Your support makes all the difference. All gifts, no matter the size, have an impact and help improve the quality of life our residents enjoy. Thank you for your support and for making a difference in the lives of seniors in our care, just as they have made a difference in building the community we enjoy today.

Families Help St. Michael's Live our Mission

When residents move into St. Michael's, we also have the privilege of getting to know many of their families and close friends. When the Gagnon family realized their beloved mother, Muriette, required more care as she was showing increasing signs of dementia, they toured several sites before asking for mom to come to live at St. Michael's Long Term Care Centre. Since arriving, Muriette has continued to be active, participating in many weekly events, attending church services in the chapel and is very happy.

Her large family come to visit her often, and when St. Michael's identified a need to purchase palliative comfort chairs allowing family members to stay overnight with their

loved ones, the Gagnon family knew they wanted to help make this happen. St. Michael's set out an appeal with a goal to raise funds to purchase 2 palliative chairs. The palliative journey is frequently an uneasy and emotional one for all involved. People living with advancing illness, family members and caregivers all require support. In an effort to ease the stress and encourage time together, St. Michael's wished to provide sleeper chairs that fold out into a bed allowing family members to spend valuable precious time with their loved one.

The goal was to raise \$10,000 to

purchase 2 chairs. The Gagnon family got together and said 'we want to purchase one of those chairs'. And they did!

Sharing this information with their family, asking all to contribute whatever they could, the Gagnon's raised in excess of \$5,000 purchasing the larger of the chairs. Ultimately, and because of their generosity, St. Michael's was able to purchase 3 palliative chairs providing comfort and peace to our palliative care residents at St. Michael's so they can enjoy sharing memories and spending some quality time with their loved ones.

We are so very grateful to this family for their thoughtfulness and generosity. Many families for years to come will see the plaque on the chair that it was donated by Family and Friends of Muriette Gagnon, leaving a legacy that will bring unmeasurable comfort.
